Once again we're pleased to bring you another edition of the AALF newsletter, *One-to-One*.

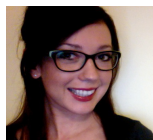

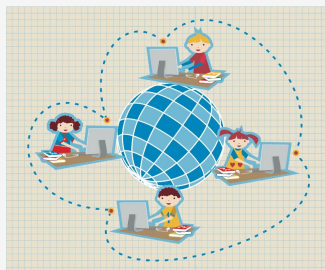

Here's how Debbie Dunwoody, Principal at Methodist Ladies' College in Australia, responded:

"I was quite surprised this year when we surveyed our students looking at potential devices for next year. And I have to admit I felt that our students would be very keen to have ipads and bring your own devices in the classrooms. What astounded me was overwhelmingly our students absolutely wanted notebooks as the base of their tools. And they wanted that because of the flexibility and because of the power of the notebook and all that it could do. So our students, whilst they love the BYOD devices, still see the limitations of them, and until they can be as good as a 1-on-1 notebook, I still think the 1-on-1 notebook will be there for a long time."

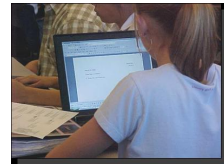
